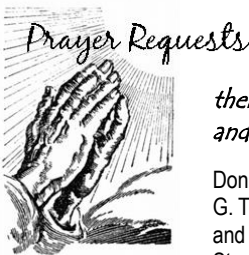

Praying for the dead is a practice that started in the early Church shortly after the Resurrection of Christ. Early Christians would go into the catacombs and hold vigils for their deceased relatives.*

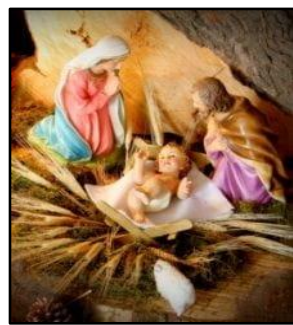
